On Tuesday 6th February we will be joining schools and youth organisations across the UK in celebrating Safer Internet Day 2024.

This year the campaign will be focusing on change online, this includes covering:

- Young people's perspective on new and emerging technology
- Using the internet to make change for the better
- The changes young people want to see online
- The things that can influence and change the way young people think, feel and act online and offline.

Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote in school, and celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasise the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year.

We have been tackling some tricky number problems in maths by looking at subtracting 2-digit from 2-digit numbers, including some challenging real-life scenarios. The children have really enjoyed working with dienes and counters to work out how to find the difference, before moving onto written methods. See if you can help with this one at home - have you ever been lucky enough to encounter this problem yourself?
