In maths, we have developed our written strategies when multiplying and dividing.

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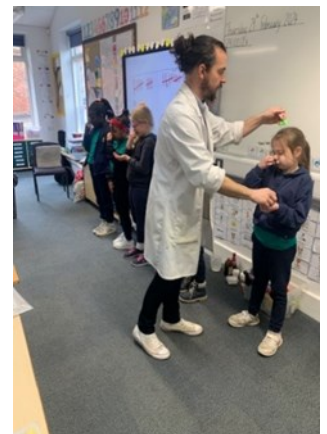
Excitingly, we have started to explore the Take One Picture project using the painting 'The Courtyard of a House in Delft' by Pieter de Hooch.

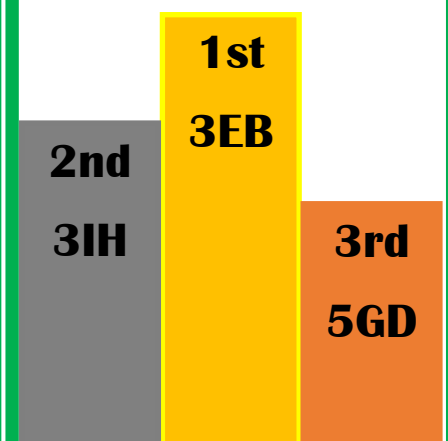
Rainbow
